### **BAISAKHI**

Gandhi Jayanti is celebrated on 2<sup>nd</sup> October as the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi (Father of Nation). Mahatma Gandhi was popularly known as 'Bapu'. He was preacher of non – violence and truth.

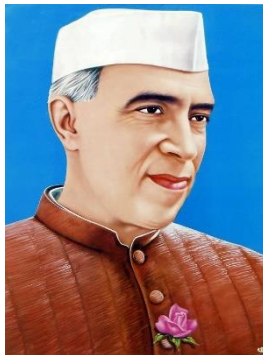
